#### Recipe of the Month

#### Surstek Av Lam - Norwegian Marinated Leg of Lamb

Popular dishes served in Norway to celebrate Easter include a main course of lamb. Here's a savory recipe from well-known Scandinavian cookbook author Beatrice Ojakangas.

Serves 10

#### **Ingredients:**

6 - 6 1/2 lbs. leg of lamb

2 quarts fat-free buttermilk

2 tsp. salt

2 Tbsp. flour

1 cup water

1/2 cup sour cream

salt and pepper

#### **Directions:**

Preheat oven to 325°F. Trim the leg of lamb.

Place in a non-aluminum pan or in a large, heavy-duty plastic bag. Pour the buttermilk over the lamb and refrigerate for 3 to 4 days. Turn the lamb often if the milk does not cover it completely. Remove the lamb from the milk and discard the milk.

Dry the meat and rub it with the salt. Place it on a rack in a roasting pan. Pour the water into the bottom of the pan.



Insert a meat thermometer into the thickest part of the roast, being careful not to let the thermometer touch the bone. Roast for approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes, or until the meat reaches 160°F.

Deglaze the roasting pan by adding a little water to it and stirring up the drippings from the bottom of the pan. Strain the drippings and blend in the flour. Cook, stirring, until the gravy is thickened. Add the sour cream, salt, and pepper.

Slice the roast and serve with the gravy.

#### And in Alaska last month—the Iditarod with two entries from Norway!

The "Last Great Race" begins in downtown Anchorage with a ceremonial start on **March 5, 2022**. The 11-mile route does not officially count in the standings. On Sunday, March 6, 2022, mushers depart from Willow starting at 2 p.m., in two-minute intervals. This is called the Iditarod Restart. The race ended 3/19 at 23:39:13 when the last musher Apayauq Reitan crossed the finish line. The winner was Brent Sass from Eureka, Alaska with a time of 8 days 14 hours 38 minutes and 43 seconds. It is his first Iditarod win but has raced it 5 times before.

**Joar Leifseth Ulsom** (2018 champion) from Norway came in 11th place this year and **Hanna Lyrek** (rookie) came in 19th and was the fastest rookie! 49 teams started the race, with 775 dogs. All teams must start with 16 to 12 dogs and finish with at least 6. Joar finished with 7 dogs and Hanna with 8. Both started with started with 14.

Joar Leifseth Ulsom grew up in beautiful Norway, just south of the Arctic circle. With a love of nature, adventure, and dogs, becoming a musher tied everything together nicely for him. In 2011, Joar moved from Norway to Alaska with his kennel of seventeen dogs and started applying himself to learning the ropes of racing.

Hanna Lyrek is a 22-yr old girl from Alaska who lives in Norway. She has always driven dogs and the Iditarod has been the biggest dream of hers. Her family moved to Norway when she was five years old and have live in Alta since. These past four years she has driven the longest races in Norway and finally can chase her biggest dream of running the Iditarod.

#### Ten Reasons to Visit Norway in the Spring

1. Urban Utepils (pronounced "OOH-ta pilz")

As the first sign of spring appears and the their houses to make the most of the new locals taking to the street to enjoy the first

temperature rises, Norwegians pour out of season. The pavement starts to buzz with outdoor beer of the season.

#### 2. The fjords in full bloom.

Tens of thousands of fruit trees are blooming by the fjords framed by the still snow covered majestic and picturesque views of the mountains. The most famous place to view is the Hardanger region.

#### 3. Waterfalls at their mightiest.

The dramatic Norwegian waterfalls roar to life in Spring. One does not have to look far to be in awe of their majesty. Voringsfossen, in Hardanger, is one of the most magnificent.

#### 4. The birds at their liveliest.

Norway coastline is bristling with life at this time of year. In the north, Varanger has become one of the most impressive destinations in the world to view Arctic birds. One might see White-tailed eagles, gyrfallons, Steller's eider and Arctic sea ducks. This would be ideal time to witness the birds returning to their breeding grounds.

#### 5. Farmers Markets and Food Festivals

Farmers markets are held all over Norway and that along with food festivals are a key part of Norway's trendy culinary revolution. Two of the best may be found in the streets of Oslo.

#### 6. Wake up in the top of a tree.

Architecture lovers should seek out some of the treetop huts that have a very stylish and unique design. Wake up where the birds are singing and view life from above.

#### 7. Dive into crystal clear waters.

At this time of year, the waters of Norway are crystal clear.

The water will start to get warmer as Spring turns into Summer. Relax as you dive as nothing in Norway waters will eat you! Check out the underwater wrecks in Narvik for a full adventure.

#### 8. First outdoor swim of year.

Are you a real Viking? Prove it by taking at least a few bold strokes in the cold spring water. Dive into the cold water and follow with a stylish sauna or vice versa.



#### 9. Experience the glaciers.

Venture across ice that maybe more than a thousand years old. Not all glacier walks are demanding but skiing or hiking the Jostedalsbreen glacier (137 miles) is a favorite for the fit.

#### 10. Spring Skiing

Vårskiturer, or spring skiing is very popular in Norway. There is usually plenty of soft and untouched snow as late as April or May.

#### Påskekrim and the Milk Carton Mysteries

It wouldn't be an Easter holiday in Norway without the tradition of reading gripping crime novels. This unusual combination dates back to 1923, when publisher Gyldendal pulled a media stunt to boost spring book sales. The ploy worked, and a national ritual was born.

Many Norwegians head to the hytte (cabin) over Easter break, and their laid-back vacation days pair well reading by the fire. Each spring, various publishers release special collections of novellas called Påskekrim along with many full-length novels. Other media channels have followed suit, producing crime radio plays, tv shows, films and podcasts.

Since 1997, TINE dairy cooperative has printed family-friendly whodunit comics on their milk cartons for Norwegians to solve over breakfast during Easter break. Private detective Ulf Ulvheim (en ulv – a wolf, naturally) has been a recurring character in the Easter-related detective strips. Famous crime writers such as Jo Nesbø, Anne Holt and Gunnar Staalesen and others have authored the storylines. As of 2021, the milk mysteries went digital, to the consternation of many citizens.

Whether you are visiting a hytte, reading mysteries, or enjoying milk, God Påske! Happy Easter!


