### **Recipe of the Month**

### Kardemommeboller -- Cardamom Buns

(A sweet dinner roll)

Ingredients:

2 cups milk

¼ cup butter

¼ cup margarine

1 pkg active dry yeast

1/4 cup warm water

¾ cup sugar

1 T sugar

½ tsp salt

6 whole cardamom seeds, crushed

7 cups flour

#### **Directions:**

Scald milk. Add butter and margarine and let stand until melted and milk is slightly cooled.

Soften yeast in warm water with 1 Tablespoon sugar.

In large bowl add remaining sugar, salt and cardamom.

Pour in lukewarm

milk mixture. Add yeast and enough flour to make stiff dough. Work thoroughly.

Place in greased bowl. Cover and let rise until double in size. Punch down and shape into balls the size of ping pong balls.

Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Place balls 1 inch apart on greased baking sheet. Cover and let rise to double in size.

Bake in oven for 5 (five) minutes. (No lie, it only takes 5 minutes) Brush with butter while still hot.

### **May in Norway**


On 17 May we **commemorate the signing of the constitution** on that date in 1814. In Norway, Constitution Day is huge. While many countries celebrate their national day with a military parade, Norway's 17<sup>th</sup> of May is more of a party for everyone, especially the children. The Constitution of Norway was signed at Eidsvoll, Norway on May 17, 1814, when Norway was becoming free from its union with Denmark and hoped to be independent. Alas, that was not to happen for another 90 some years.



#### Answers to Norwegian Trivia plus extra information about Norway!

- 1. Norway had 19 counties (fylker) earlier and 11 now. In 2017 the government decided to abolish some of the counties and to merge them with other counties to form larger ones, reducing the number of counties from 19 to 11, which was then implemented on 1 January 2020. The counties form the first-level administrative divisions of Norway and are further subdivided into 356 municipalities (kommune). The capital Oslo is both a county and a municipality. Two of the newly merged counties (Viken and Troms og Finnmark) have seen popular opposition before, during, or after the mergers, and have stated their desire to split up again. Some opposition parties have stated their willingness to undo any of the aforementioned mergers if they win a majority in the next general election if the residents of the area so choose.
- 2. The island territories of Svalbard and Jan Mayen are outside the county division and ruled directly at the national level. The Governor of Svalbard (Norwegian: Sysselmesteren på Svalbard) represents the Norwegian government in exercising its sovereignty over the Svalbard archipelago (Spitsbergen). This landmass is perhaps best known for its "doomsday seed vault" and the fact that it has more polar bears than people.
- 3. **Svalbard population is around 2,500**. This population is made up of around 1450 Norwegians, 1150 Russians/Ukranians and 10 Polish. **Jan Mayan less than 50**! The only inhabitants on the island of Jan Mayan are personnel working for the Norwegian Armed Forces and the Norwegian Meteorological Institute. Eighteen people spend the winter on the island, but the population may roughly double (35) during the summer, when heavy maintenance is performed.
- 4. **Harald Fairhair**. In 866AD, Harald united all the small kingdoms of Norway under his rule. His many sons caused the kingdom much grief, as Harald gave all of them royal titles, and all of them wanted the throne. Harald died in 933AD at the ripe old age of 83.
- 5. **Harald V is the King of Norway**. He acceded to the throne on **17 January 1991**. Harald was the third child and only son of King Olav V and Princess Märtha of Sweden. He was second in the line of succession at the time of his birth, behind his father.
- 6. The Constitution of Norway was passed unanimously by the Eidsvoll Assembly on **16 May 1814 and signed the next day**. The assembly then elected Christian Frederick, prince of Denmark and Norway as king 17 May 1814. He abdicated 14 August 1814 having lost battle with the King of Sweden for control of Norway (see #9).
- 7. The celebrations began spontaneously among students and others from early on as a celebration of Norway. But, but as Norway was in a union with Sweden (1814-1905), **King Karl Johan of Sweden and Norway banned the festivities between 1820 and 1829**. The Norwegian government was presided over by viceroys: Swedes until 1829, Norwegians until 1856 when that office was vacated. Thus, the Norwegian viceroys reintroduced the day of celebration in 1829.
- 8. From **1870**, the 17th of May festivities became more established in Norway, with the first parade being a **children's parade** in Christiania (now Oslo), an initiative taken by the author Bjørnstjerne Bjørnson, who also wrote the national anthem "Ja, vi elsker dette landet". The 17<sup>th</sup> of May continues to be a big day for children, but adults can join in too!
- 9. Denmark had aligned with the losing side and Sweden with the winning side of the Napoleonic wars. On 7 January 1814, about to be overrun by Swedish, Russian, and German troops under the command of the elected crown prince of Sweden, king Frederick VI of Denmark agreed to cede Norway to the king of Sweden in order to avoid an occupation of Jutland. Under the Treaty of Kiel, signed on 14 January 1814, Denmark was forced to surrender Norway to Sweden one of the victors of the Napoleonic wars. However, Norway had other ideas and wrote a constitution and elected a king in 1814 (see #6). A short war between Norwegian King Christian Frederick and the Swedish King Charles II ended with a win for Sweden.
- 10. Norway proclaimed and secured their independence from Sweden on September 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1905.
- 11. **Galdhøpiggen** is 2469 meters high. It is also the highest mountain in northern Europe. It was first climbed in 1850; the climber is unknown. However, during the winter, Glittertind may appear higher than Galdhøpiggen due to its glacier on the top, but the glacier is not counted when measuring the height.
- 12. Gotcha! **Oslo and Oslo**!. (However, see another opinion in #15.) Oslo was founded in 1040 under the name Ánslo and became a Norwegian capital at the beginning of the 14th century. However, because

Norway was often part of unions with other Scandinavian countries, the city was not as powerful as it might otherwise have been. In 1624 the town of Oslo was completely destroyed by fire. King Christian IV decreed that the town should be moved west, closer to the protection of Akershus Fortress. This new town was called Christiania and was laid out with wide streets which met at right angles, designed to hinder the spread of fire. According to an official spelling reform (that changed ch to k) the form was changed to Kristiania in 1877. In 1925, that city incorporated the village of Oslo, where the old capital had been, and the city adopted the old name. Oslo is the current capital and largest city in Norway, with a population of just over 1 million.

13. **Oslo**. The park is famous for its many statues by Gustav Vigeland.



- 14. **Sweden, Finland, and Russia**. In 1751 a treaty was signed in Strömstad, defining the Swedish-Norwegian border and the Finnish-Norwegian border, based on field investigations and negotiations done 1738—1751. The Russian-Norwegian border line was defined by a treaty in 1826 and essentially remains the same border today.
- 15. **Tønsberg** is generally regarded as the oldest city in Norway, founded by Harald Fairhair around 870 AD. It was and is a seafaring town. It is located around 102 kilometres (63 miles) south-southwest of Oslo on the western coast of the Oslofjord near its mouth onto the Skagerrak. Since it was the only city at the time and Harald Fairhair ruled from there, some consider it the first capital of Norway.
- 16. **Independent 872-1387**, although sometimes under a king also ruling other countries (e.g., Denmark and England). The Kalmar Union of Norway, Sweden, and Denmark existed between 1387-1523. Denmark-Norway split from Sweden, 1524-1814. Norway was independent for a few months in 1814. Then Norway was in union with Sweden from 1814-1905. Norway was **independent again in 1905 and to the present**.
- 17. That is a debate for another time!
