





Recipe of the month

Yield: Approximately 15 potato dumplings

Norwegian Potato Dumplings (Potato Klub)

Please note: The flour amount is approximate. You want the ingredients to stick together. This recipe used about 2 cups of flour, but start with one and go from there.

Prep Time 20 minutes, Cook Time 30 minutes, Total Time 50 minutes

Ingredients

- 5 large Russet potatoes, peeled and grated
- 2 large eggs
- 2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 pork chop, cut into bite-sized pieces (or meat from a pork hock, ham or bacon)
- For serving: Butter, salt and pepper, chopped parsley and/or green onion

Instructions

- 1. **Prepare mixture**: Place grated potatoes in a large mixing bowl. Add eggs and mix with your hands (I find this is the easiest way given the thick, heavy batter). Add 1 cup of flour and then keep adding flour until the potato mixture sticks together. This was about 2 cups when I made it.
- 2. **Form into balls**: Take about 1/2 cup of the potato mixture. Place piece of pork chop in the middle and form into a ball. Repeat until all of the potatoes have been used.
- 3. **Cook dumplings**: Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Add potato dumplings one at a time. Cook for 30 minutes in simmering water. At 30 minutes, take one dumpling out and test to see if the meat inside is cooked. If not, cook for a little longer. My batch took 30 minutes.
- 4. **Serving**: Serve hot, topped with melted butter, salt and pepper, and parsley and/or chopped green onion.



You don't need to be of Scandinavian decent to eat like one, have fun like one and enjoy life like one. Check out what Sons of Norway & Edmonds Lodge provides members on page 5 in this newsletter.

Iditarod update: Peter Kaiser, from Bethel, Alaska, and his dogs won the race from Anchorage to Nome in 9 days 12 hours 39 minutes. Our Norwegian, Joar Liefseth Ulsom, came in second, 12 minutes behind Peter. The Red Lantern (last place finish) went to rookie Victoria Hardwick, from Bethel, Alaska, who took 13 days 23 hours. Niklas Wikstrand, the Norwegian Rookie scratched after 8 days on the trail. The trail was unusually warm this year, making for ice and difficult running in many areas.

Our **April 10th Lodge Meeting Program** features **Dave Ellingson**. He will talk about his one month kayak adventure on the Sogne and Hardanger Fjords in Norway which is also featured in his book, *Paddle Pilgrim: Kayaking the Fjords of Norway*, and his 25-min documentary, "*Coming Home*." "Coming Home" recently played to great reviews at the Oneota Film Festival in Iowa! He will be entering the documentary in a number of film festivals in the U.S. and Norway in the coming weeks.

Cultural Corner

So you want to learn some Norwegian? Taking a trip to visit relatives or site see in Norway? Or perhaps refresh your memory of what you learned earlier? There are several avenues available to learn.

First of all, there is the Sons of Norway website. Here you will find 37 Language Lessons that you see and hear, Norwegian Reading for Comprehension that teaches you about Norwegian grammar, and the Cultural Skills Program, including the one on Language and Culture.

The S/N Cultural Skills unit for Language and Culture is different from all the others. There are still three parts; however, you may earn two in language and one in culture, or earn two in culture and one in language. And you receive two bars as long as you do at least one level in language and one level in culture. Part 1 is Language, Part 2 is Culture and Part 3 is Language or Culture.

How to get to the Cultural items on the Sons of Norway website

Go to https://www.sofn.com.lf it is your first time logging in, you will need your membership number to log in. Then you may change your login to your email address or whatever you choose. (Write it down!)

Now, click on the white box outlined in red in the upper right corner that says "Member Resources."

Scroll down to the third item, Cultural Programming, and click on the "Learn more" box. From this page, you have several choices: For now, you can go to Language Lessons or Norwegian Reading for Comprehension or Cultural Skills Program.

If you choose Cultural Skills Program, you can now scroll down to Norwegian Language and Culture. From there you can print the PDF of the entire unit or go to the YouTube playlist to work on the 10 lessons on language and culture.

There is also a free course on the Internet called **Norwegian on the Web** at this website:

https://www.ntnu.edu/norwegiancourse/norwegian-on-the-web. It was created for foreign students who go to Norway to study at the Norwegian University of Science and Technology, or NTNU.

Third, there is another free course on the Internet for learning many languages, including Norwegian, called **Duolingo**. What I like about this course is that you hear the language and have to speak it as well. Find it this website:

https://www.duolingo.com/course/no-BO/en/Learn-Norwegian%20Bokm%C3%A5l

Fourth, there are several text books of Norwegian in our own Edmonds Lodge library. They provide a way to review vocabulary, learn about grammar, and practice reading and writing, etc.

Our own **Viking** magazine always has the president's message in both English and Norwegian. Try reading it in Norwegian first, and then read it again in English to see if you got the gist of it.

There are several other websites on the Internet that can help you learn Norwegian, such as one named **Norwegian Blog**. You can sign up to get it in your inbox.

The **Norwegian-American** newspaper is the only one left that is published in American. It has a page of news stories in Norwegian, plus amazing articles about Norway and Norwegians. Subscriptions are \$70 a year for a weekly issue. Share a subscription with a friend! We could ask members who subscribe to bring back issues to our meetings to share, and keep a few months of issues available. These would be useful to find a subject for writing an article for your optional activity for the cultural part of the Language and Culture unit.

One of the most difficult things about learning a language is not having an opportunity to practice. Some years ago, we had a table set up at our dinners for those who wanted to practice speaking Norwegian. Should we reinstitute that practice? See how it goes for a few months? **Hva venter du på?** (What are you waiting for?)

What is next?

We have two more sessions on genealogy: Part 3 in April, and in May we will finish up any paperwork that is still outstanding and submit completed levels not already submitted earlier. In May, we will also begin the Reading Cultural Skill. Now that you know how to find the Cultural Skills on the Sons of Norway website, I will let you look up the unit yourself, and print it off as you desire. For those who do not have computers or printers, and who want to participate (or continue if you have already started), I'll hand out units, so let me know if you want me to print one for you. Before the evening concludes, I hope you will check out some books from our library to read over the summer, so when we come back in September you will have some paperwork ready to submit!
