Edmonds Lodge had a dozen attendees at our November gathering and less at our December Christmas party. Those attending had a lot of fun. The November dinner potluck was quite varied



business meeting of the Lodge. We will continue with Zoom type meetings on the second Wednesday of the month for the time being, but are considering places to have in


person meetings. All members are encouraged to attend, and an agenda will be sent out to all Lodge members prior to the meeting.

There are at least 9 holidays celebrated during this season. My favorite is the Solstice (Dec 21) when days start to get longer again.

Before then there is St Nicholus Day (12/6) and St Lucia Day (12/13) both honoring saints.

• Christmas is Dec 25th.

This is followed closely by Kwanzaa, a cultural holiday (12/26 – 1/1)

Hanukkah is celebrated on the 25th day of Kislev, which can be ant time in late November to late December.

Then there is News Year's Day which everybody celebrates, usually the evening before!

The twelve days of Christmas end with Epiphany or 3 Kings Day (1/5).

Recipes of the Month - Salad and Yams

Recipes from Jody Sigveland and Norma Jean Sands

From our November Potluck dinner.

7 Layer Salad

Lettuce, ½ head
Green Onions (4)
Celery (2 stalks)
Tomatoes (1 ½)
Petite Peas (1/2 box)
Ham or Bacon or Shrimp
grated Cheddar Cheese (1 to 2 cups)
3 or 4 hard boiled Eggs
Parmesan Cheese ½ cup

Dressing
2 cup Mayonnaise
1 tsp Season Salt
2 tbsp Sugar
1/4 to 1/2 tsp Garlic Powder

Layer the ingredients in a glass bowl so you can see the layers. Wisk up the dressing and pour over the salad. Cool in refrigerator.

Candied Yams

3 lbs ruby sweet potatos (yams) cut into 2" chunks

Kosher Salt

2 cups orange juice

1-11/4 cup brown sugar

½ tsp cinnamon

4 tbsp butter

- 1. Boil yams 5-10 min until semi soft.
- 2. Mix rest of ingredients in shallow sauté pan and bring to boil on high heat.
- 3. Add yams, coat well, and bring to boil until sauce reduces to syrup ~10 min.
- 4. Place in serving dish and serve!
- 5. If not served immediately, reheat at 350 for 10-15 min and serve.

Christmas in Norway

Norwegians have the custom of advent calendars, or julekalender, which check off the days from December 1st to 24th. They are windows to open to find a new holiday scene and perhaps a piece of chocolate. St Lucia (Dec 13) is, in a way, the start of Christmas season. It is a festival of lights in the dark part of the year with young girls wearing wreaths of candles on their heads. In a ceremony where a girl is elected to portray Lucia, she wears a white gown with a red sash and a crown of candles on her head and then walks at the head of a procession of women, each holding a candle. Christmas really starts when the family gathers to decorate the Christmas tree on Lille Juleaften (Dec 23rd). Christmas Eve is the time when presents are exchanged. The gifts are sometimes brought by the Julenissen. Or the children can pick up the presents from under the Christmas Tree and read the cards on the presents out loud, handing them to the lucky recipient. On Christmas Eve, Norwegians make sure to give the Julemisse JULEGRØT (rice porridge with sugar, cinnamon, and butter) to ensure nice treatment from him in the following year.

Det er veldig viktig å gi grøt til nissen på julaften. Eller så går det galt. Da gjør han rampestreker. It is very important to give porridge to the house/farm elf on Christmas Eve. Otherwise everything can go wrong. Then he (the elf) makes much mischief. Maybe the most famous custom about Christmas in Norway is the big Christmas Tree that Norway gives to the United Kingdom every year. The tree is given as a present to say thank you for the help that the people of the UK gave to Norway during World War II. The tree stands in Trafalgar Square in the middle of London and often thousands of people come to watch when the lights are turned on.
