And what is happening in Edmonds?

Snohomish County is now in Phase 2 of recovery while King County is in a modified Phase 1. For both, that means "Gather with no more than 5 people outside your household per week." In phase 3 we can have gathering of up to 50 people, so let's hope we are in Phase 3 by July. Our **Lodge picnic** is scheduled for July 21 and has the advantage of being outside. Rather than a traditional potluck, it may be "Bring and Eat Your Own Food". Also taking place outside are the two district events: The **District 2 Steak Fry** at Trollhaugan July 18th with horseshoes and kubb is set for July 18th and the **Golf Tournament** in Leavenworth August 1st (see posters below). Pair up with some one and swing a stick (kubb) or club (golf)!

However, the Border Fest for July has been cancelled and the 4th of July parade in Edmonds also.

In our Lodge (Edmonds 2-130) in June we record 211 members, 42 of whom are Golden members (age 65 and

above and 30+years in SON). Sam Molvik, Vernon Wilson, and Marvin Bueing are all new Golden Members this past March and April. We have one Life Member, Mary Ovstedal, who has been a SON member for 64 years (yes, she is somewhat over 65 years of age)! And then all the birthdays since we have been shut down, 21 in June alone! We will have to celebrate our members when we get back together in September! And what is happening in Norway?

Norway has successfully flattened and dropped the curve in coronavirus cases in Norway. The peak number of new cases per day occurred in late March at 425. It has declined since then to near zero the end of May. There may be a slight increase in June.



Much like our phases of recovery in Washington State, Prime Minister Erna Solberg announced a timetable for when most of the remaining restrictions will be lifted. All schools were permitted to reopen from May 11, while much of everyday life will return to normal by June 15. There is still a ban on major events until September 1. Most foreign citizens are still not allowed into the country (see one exception below from our Marines in Setermoen). Speaking of winter training exercises in Arctic Norway, I remember back in 1970 near Alta in northern Norway, on a skiing fieldtrip with the Tromsø Teaching College I was attending,

running into a number of troups on break from winter training exercises; they were from numerous countries in Europe and from the US. Many had never been on skies before. Or experienced such cold. Back to today in Norway -

Social distancing requirements in Norway will remain in place. This means that although one can host up to 20 people at private events at one's home, people are adviced to stay at least one meter (~ a yard) from one another. Finally, it seems that the Norwegian postal service is currently unable to handle deliveries to certain countries, including the USA and Canada. So if you were waiting for a package from Norway

And what is happening Globally?

It is hard to miss what is happening globally, and it all started with one event in Minneapolis (the straw that broke the camel's back)! As the Sons of Norway new HQ building is located in that city, they have provided an update on conditions on their Website:

SON June 1 (https://www.sofn.com/minneapolis/):

Minneapolis has been the site of significant riots in the past week. The epicenter of these riots has been Lake St. in south Minneapolis where the new Sons of Norway headquarters building is located.

We at Sons of Norway are grieving the racism that is still so prevalent in our society and the violence we've seen in our streets in response. We continue to hope and work for a more peaceful, just, and inclusive society; and believe our fraternal purpose of strengthening our communities continues to play an important role in achieving this shared goal.

Our staff is safe and no one has been harmed or seen property destroyed. We are most thankful for this.

The new Sons of Norway headquarters has not been damaged. This is in spite of the fact that the building is only a few blocks from some of the worst of the riots. Again, we are so grateful that the new building we are scheduled to move into later this month has not seen any damage.

We have not received our mail the last several days. The post office where Sons of Norway's mail is routed was in the middle of the affected area and has been closed indefinitely. It is possible some mail was destroyed in the damage on May 27th, but limited to afternoon mail only. Since May 28, 2020 we have not been able to receive our mail from the postal service.

The fact that the movement has spread globally and, in most part, remains peaceful, gives us hope. (The vast majority in the US – 80% – appeared to be peaceful, according to new research from Ipsos, the University of Chicago, and Oxford. Elsewhere in the world news coverage suggests most are peaceful.)

Protests have emerged in Norway too.



Protests were registered in Lillehammer, Arendal, Stord, Hamar, Oslo, Bergen, Kristiansand, Tromsø, Haugesund, Alta, Volda and other parts of the country. This picture could from most places around the western world, but it is from Trondheim.

As social activities slowly increase and attendance at rallies continues, take care and wear your masks when you go out. The virus is no less potent, and vaccines are yet to come, although research into them looks promising.

SETERMOEN, Norway --

Whether in the face of the enemy or a deadly global pandemic, the U.S. Marine Corps not only stays ahead of the curve but also flattens it.

.... Marines and Sailors with 3rd Battalion, 2nd Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division, II Marine Expeditionary Force, successfully deployed to Norway in May 2020 as Marine Rotational Force-Europe 20.2, Marine Forces Europe and Africa, which focuses on cold-weather and mountain-warfare training and military-to military engagements to enhance interoperability with allies and partners.

During the deployment process, the battalion mandated strict social distancing, hygiene protocol, and mask donning, and U.S. Navy Corpsmen continuously screened Marines and Sailors for any symptoms of the virus. Once in Norway, a 14-day quarantine was executed.

After a successful 14-day quarantine where the battalion saw zero COVID cases, Marines and Sailors immediately transitioned into the annual interoperability exercise, Thunder Reindeer, located in Norway's Arctic Circle.


