Tax Update

Taxes are going up. They must. If you are on a fixed income that is taxed, you should consider converting that money into a tax-free plan this year. Though the Federal tax proposal looks like a long shot-given the political environment-be aware that new <u>estate death taxes</u>, <u>capital gains taxes</u>, and <u>income-tax</u> increases are coming.

In WA we have a slew of taxes coming out over the next few years. The most urgent is for WA workers-a <u>payroll tax</u> for Long Term Care insurance is now in its final months of preparation. Presidents Message for Summer Newsletter

Norwegians start their summer festivities with Midsummer Night's Eve, 'St. Hans Aften', or 'Jonsok-kveld', celebrated on 23rd June. The celebration includes partying, good food, music, dancing, and huge bonfires. The burning of bonfires was thought to have special cleansing powers and used to expel evil spirits. There are rumors that there may be a modified **July 4th Parade** in Edmonds, and we at Edmonds Lodge want to be ready. 



Lodge Member Highlight: Roberta Morrow

My daughter Terry introduces me thus: "This is my mom. She is obsessed with Norway." That's pretty accurate! I was born in Minneapolis. My folks divorced when I was two, so Mom and I moved to Fort Dodge, Iowa and lived with her Norwegian-born mother and Swedish-born father. Thus began my obsession! She remarried when I was 8 and we moved to Algona, Iowa where we had a photography studio. After two years at St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN, I completed my BA at the University of Colorado in Boulder. I began downhill skiing. I still love to ski and enjoy our cabin at Lake Tahoe in California whenever it is not rented to vacationers. I love renting and sharing it with others who appreciate the mountains, lake, skiing and hiking.

I spent from September 1966 to October 1968 in Europe, studying art and languages in Paris and Florence, museum-hopping through 23 countries, and meeting family in Norway, Sweden and Switzerland, where my dad's folks were born. The daughter of a photographer and artist who lectured and taught on the convention circuit, I modeled for numerous famous photographers and lectured at state and national photographic conventions from Arkansas to Hawaii.

I moved to San Francisco in 1969, married Bill Morrow, and pursued a career as an IP technical writer and editor with Levi Strauss & Co. Terry came along in 1981. Bill died in 1999, within a year of moving to Edmonds.

I became enamored with rosemaling in Europe, and taught myself upon returning to the USA. Since then, I have studied with many Norwegian and American rosemalers, taught rosemaling in San Francisco and at Sons of Norway's D6 Camp Norge at Alta, CA to both children and adults, and through Community Education and at our Sons of Norway day camp in Idaho, and D2's camp. I continued painting and teaching to Daughters and Sons of Norway lodges as well as participating in craft shows. Although I don't paint now, I still belong to some rosemaling associations, and have served as newsletter editor and president of Western Rosemalers.

I joined Henrik Ibsen Lodge in San Francisco in 1974, transferred to Gulldalen in Grass Valley while at Lake Tahoe, to Valhalla Lodge in Idaho, and finally to Edmonds Lodge. In Idaho, I founded a Sons of Norway day camp, and by the second year we had kids coming from three states!

My other interests include Hardanger embroidery, genealogy, Norwegian language, folk dancing and folk lore. I made Terry's confirmation bunad with a Hardanger blouse and apron, and also a blouse and apron for my mother's bunad. I also made Terry's wedding gown with her requested Hardanger embroidery trim. I taught Hardanger classes at home and through Community Education in Idaho, and also here.

In 2004 I completed a Genealogy and Family History certificate course at the University of Washington, and wrote a book about my Swedish grandfather. I have volunteered at the National Nordic Museum in Seattle as a docent lecturer and genealogy assistant. I performed with Leikarringen of Leif Erikson Lodge in Seattle and folk danced with the Skandia Folkdance Society. I went to Scandinavia studying folk dancing three times, toured Norway with the Scandinavian Language Institute; took a Bach, Handel and Luther tour of Germany followed by downhill skiing in the Italian Dolomites; cruised with Daughters of Norway to Alaska and also to the Baltic from England, stopping in Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Finland, Estonia and Russia. Such fun trips!

At Edmonds Lodge, I have served in many positions, earned many cultural medals, and managed the arts and crafts portion of our ScanFest for several years. In 2008, I took over as Social/Publicity Director for District 2, and later was elected Cultural/Foundation Director for a term.

I first joined Daughters of Norway as a charter member of Anna Kolbjørnsdatter in San Francisco in 1988, transferred to Valkyrien Lodgein Seattle, and then to Thelma Lodge in Everett. For 5 years I was editor of <u>Døtre av Norge</u>, the national publication of Daughters of Norway.

I am a life member of Vesterheim, the Norwegian-American Museum in Decorah, IA. I love giving programs on subjects like Vikings, immigration, rosemaling, Norway or trolls, and participating in the x-c events at Trollhaugen along with Terry and my two grandsons, Seth and Liam.

One of the traditional uses for nettles in Norwegian cuisine is to make soup with them called "*brenneslesuppe*". The soup is simple enough and sometimes features hardboiled eggs on top. Not only is this soup delicious, it was also promoted during war time as an abundant, free, and incredibly nutritious meal.

For an extra touch, I like to toss in a handful or two of peas. They add a lovely sweetness and brighten the soup even more.

This is such a simple soup to make and it's so fresh. Nettles are available throughout the spring and summer season, so you can make this soup when you like, using younger leaves. You can use any stock you wish, but I did find that a good beef stock really enhanced the overall flavor.

Wild Nettle and Pea Soup (brenneslesuppe med erter)

(Serves 4-6)

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 large onion, diced
- 2 handfuls of wild nettles leaves (about 4 cups), washed
- 4 1/4 cups (1 liter) good quality stock
- 2 cups (250 g) peas (frozen or fresh)
- Salt and pepper to taste

In a large, heavy-bottomed saucepan, melt the butter over medium-high heat. Add the onion and sauté until softened, 6-8 minutes. Toss in the nettles and cook 2-3 minutes. Add in the stock and peas. Bring to a simmer and cook, 5 minutes if using frozen peas or 10 minutes if using fresh, shelled peas. Carefully pour the soup into a blender and process until smooth or use a hand blender. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Ladle into bowls and serve while warm.






If you have been a Sons of Norway member for a few years, check with your parents or your lodge! You may be eligible for one of these fun patches that you can wear on your jacket or backpack!
