
## Protect those you love





#### Recipe of the month

**Soda Bread** This traditional bread is baked in kitchens across Ireland every day and couldn't be easier to prepare. Remember to mark the distinctive cross in it before it goes in the oven: it's to let the fairies out, apparently.

Ingredients

220g/8oz plain flour

220g/8oz whole meal flour

½ tsp salt

1 tsp baking powder or bicarbonate of soda

1 pint/500ml buttermilk

Method

Preheat the oven to 180C/350F/Gas mark 4.

Mix all the dry ingredients together in a bowl. Make a well in the center and pour in the buttermilk, use your hands to draw the flour and milk together. Next, pour ingredients onto a floured surface and lightly form into a round (do not over-knead). Cut a cross on the top. Place onto a floured baking tray and put into the oven for about 35-40 minutes.

When you take the bread out, turn it upside down and tap the bottom. If the bread sounds hollow it's done. Leave to cool on a wire rack.

#### March is Iditerod month in Alaska.

Two Norwegians will be running this year: Joar Leifseth, veteran musher and last year's winner, and Niklas Wikstrand, a rookie Iditarod musher. You can follow their progress on <a href="https://iditarod.com/">https://iditarod.com/</a>. The ceremonial start day is March 2<sup>nd</sup> at 10 am in downtown Anchorage. The official start is March 3<sup>rd</sup> at 2pm in Willow.

The biographies below are from the Iditerod website.

#### Biography

Joar Leifseth Ulsom (32) is from Mo I Rana in Norway by the Arctic Circle. In 2011 Joar traveled with his dogs from Norway to Alaska where they reside in Willow. He works full-time with his small kennel of dogs while heading up Team Racing Beringia for the non-profit Go North! Adventure Learning. Racing Beringia is an online education program exploring the region of Beringia spanning from the Yukon in Canada, across Alaska to Chukotka, Russia (RacingBeringia.com).

NOME — Norwegian musher Joar Leifseth Ulsom fulfilled his childhood dream when he and his eight-dog team crossed the finish line here, **winning** the **2018 Iditarod** Trail Sled Dog Race after 9 days and 12 hours on the trail. "It's unreal," said the 31-year-old musher who currently lives in Willow.

#### Biography

Niklas Wikstrand, 28, was born and raised in Romerike, NORWAY. He first became interested in dog mushing while watching "Iron Will" as a kid. But his first experience came when he started a class called "Mushing & Outdoors Life" at the school, Folkehøgskolen 69° Nord! Then he had one year as a handler and soldier in the Norwegian Air Force-K9. After that he studied biology for one year and ran a recreational team. In 2013, he moved to Svalbard to become an Arctic Nature Guide. After graduation, he worked as a guide taking guests out with dog sleds, kayaking, hiking, skiing, snow machining, glacier walking and camping, until he came to Alaska in 2016 to be Pete Kaiser's handler for one year (and has now been there three years). When he is in Norway, he still works as a guide and the last year as an assistant at the local veterinarian clinic. Niklas lists his hobbies as climbing, biking, reading, Ice Hockey, snow machining, hiking and camping. He says, "I am looking forward to the adventure of travelling through Alaska with the dogs I've gotten to know for the last three years. I don't know which of Pete's dogs I will be running, but it doesn't matter, because I like them all and I think we'll have fun out there."
