Presidents Message

November 2019

Happy November to all. November may seem dark and cold (here in the Northwest as well as Norway) but we here in the U.S. can look forward to Thanksgiving and family gatherings. It is also election month and I hope everyone exercises their right to vote. It is important to maintain democracy.

At our Edmonds Lodge meeting this month (November 13) we will be having our Thanksgiving dinner with turkey and all the fixings. And we will also be having our officer elections. So do come and enjoy great food, great company and the chance to vote for next year's officers.

What do Norwegians celebrate in November? The second Sunday (Sønday Novembre 10.) is Farsdag (Fathers Day).

To go back in history, November was the month Haakon VII, original name Christian Frederik Carl Georg Valdemar Axel, (born Aug. 3, 1872, Charlottenlund, Denmark—died Sept. 21, 1957, Oslo, Norway) was elected King of Norway in 105 following the independence from a union with Sweden. His reign started 18 November 1905; he arrived in Norway November 25th and was formally coronated the following year.

Norway;s next king was Olav V who reigned from his father's death 21 September 1957until his own death on 17 January 1991. Olav was the only child of King Haakon VII of Norway and Maud of Wales.

Harald V (born 21 February 1937) is the current King of Norway, having ascended to the throne upon the death of his father King Olav V on 17 January 1991.

Norway is considered a "parliamentary representative democratic constitutional monarchy". Now that is a mouthful. The parliament (Storting) is voted on in it's entirety (169 members) every four years. The next election is September 2021. The prime minister is by convention the leader of the party with majority support in parliament. Erna Solberg of the Conservatives (Høyre) is the current prime minister. The Labour Party (Arbeiderpartiet) has more seats than the Conservatives (49 to 45), but there are nine Parties represented in the parliament and the Conservatives coalition is larger than Labours (88 to 81).

According to the Democracy Index, which is compiled the Economist Intelligence Unit of the United Kingdom, there are just a handful of nations that are full democracies. And according to their 2018 index, Norway ranks at the top! Active participation of one's citizens in politics and civics is an important factor in the ranking. So, get out there and vote, in your local elections and in Edmonds Lodge elections.



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Oppskrift Edmonds Recipe of the month

I made about 12 fritters out of this recipe which should feed four people as a lunch or starter with a salad. You could serve it with some boiled new potatoes for a main course. You could also make smaller flatter cakes and serve them as canapés with drinks. Just top with a blob of the sauce and a sprig of dill. You should get about 24 and they will obviously not take as long to cook.

Beetroot Fritters with Horseradish & Dill Yoghurt Sauce

Serves 4, makes about 12. Vegetarian, gluten-free. Adapted from The Times Food & Drink

450 g beetroot, peeled & grated (use gloves dad) 150 g carrots, peeled & grated (could use parsnips) 1 shallot, finely chopped 50 g blanched almonds, finely chopped 2 tsp dried thyme 1 tsp ground coriander 100 g rolled oats 3 eggs, lightly beaten salt & black pepper dill sprigs to serve toasted cumin seeds, to serve crumbled feta, to serve (optional) For the Horseradish Sauce: 200 ml Greek yoghurt/goat's yoghurt or crème fraiche (or a mix) 2-4 Tbsp horseradish sauce (or fresh grated horseradish) 2 Tbsp lemon juice 1/2 tsp honey salt & black pepper fresh dill, chopped Mix together the peeled & grated beetroot & carrot with the shallot, almonds, thyme, coriander, oats, eggs, salt & black pepper in a bowl until well combined, cover and leave in the fridge for at least

an hour. I left some overnight for lunch the next day and it was still good.

Preheat the oven to 18oC. Using gloves, take a handful of the mix and squeeze it into a fritter shape (squeezing out any liquid) and place on a plate while you make the rest.



Heat 2 Tbsp oil in a frying pan until hot. Then cook the tritters over a medium high heat on both sides until crispy, about 2 minutes a side. Remove with a slotted spoon to an ovenproof dish and bake for about 25 minutes.

Make the sauce by mixing the yoghurt/crème fraiche with the horseradish. Start with 2 Tbsp horseradish and add more if needed, I am a horseradish wimp though. Then add the lemon, honey, dill salt & pepper and taste. Adjust as required.

Toast some cumin seeds in a pan until fragrant.

To serve: make a little tower of beetroot fritters and generously drizzle over the horseradish sauce. Sprinkle over some cumin seeds, some crumbled feta (if using) and top with a sprig of fresh dill. I served them with a radicchio and watercress salad with a lemon & olive oil dressing.



Congratulations to our very own Amos Chapman Jr.

Following dedication is from the Edmonds News, October 27th, 2019.

Edmonds resident and World War II veteran Amos Chapman Jr. recently received the Congressional Gold Medal for his participation in the U. S. Navy during war activities in the Philippines. The medal is the highest honor Congress can bestow on an American.

In a letter that accompanied the medal, Washington's US Senator Patty Murray lauded Chapman's contributions, saying "You have demonstrated incredible dedication tour country, and your sacrifices will never be forgotten." He was one of 28 veterans who received the award, 26 of whom are now deceased, at the event held Oct. 19 at the Mt. Tahoma High School Auditorium in Tacoma.

Since the American Revolution, Congress has commissioned gold medals as its highest expression of national appreciation for distinguished achievements and contributions, according to Sen. Murray, who is a senior

member of the Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee.

Amos, now 94 years old, is still an active member of Edmonds American Legion Post 66 and Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 8870. The award was given to recognize his service along with his fellow Washington State Filipino and American World War II veterans, according to Murray's letter.

Amos joined the Navy in May 1943, at the age of 17. He was assigned to serve aboard the Fletcher-Class destroyer, USS Killen, in the Pacific as a Fire Controller. His ship was engaged in the Battles for Leyte Gulf during which the ship was under constant attack by artillery, air and Kamikaze attacks.


