The Foundation was only established in 1966 but has become a vital part of supporting our appreciation of Norwegian culture and in adding Lodges and members in times of need. Leif Erikson Day

Leif Eriksson is believed to have been the first European to land in North America. He was born as Eiriksstaoir in Iceland. His Dad, Erik the Red, fled to Iceland from Norway after killing some of the King's men. Eirik was also outlawed in Iceland and was credited with discovering Greenland. In Iceland Eirik met Leifs mother, Thjodjilder. He had 2 brothers and a half sister.

Leif was sent to the new lands by the king after returning to Norway and becoming a Christian. He established a Norse settlement in the northern tip of Newfoundland, Canada, around the year 1000 AD. This settlement is called L'Anse aux Meadows today. In 1960, proof was found to the existence, and a reproduction of the site exists there today as a tourist attraction. Leif was young in his early 20's when he made the discovery and only stayed there less than a year. The settlement became a base camp to future exploration. Leif died in Greenland in 1020.

In 1964, the United States Congress declared October 9th, Leif Eriksson Day, in honor of this historical Viking. He shares this date with Father's Day in Sweden and Columbus Day which is being celebrated on October 11th.

Foundation Update

Hallo! We are quickly approaching the best month of the year, October. Why October, you might ask? Well, October is Foundation Month at Sons of Norway. Foundation Month is a time to celebrate and support the services that the Foundation provides to all members. Discover Your Scandinavian Family Roots!

Sno-Isle Genealogy Society invites you to spend an evening discovering how YOU can uncover your Scandinavian roots via ZOOM.

Have some words that look like place names but you cannot find them on a map? Was it Larson, Larsen or Larsson? Then you have come to the right place. Scandinavian records, composed of Sweden, Denmark and Norway, are some of the easiest to use and many of the skills for one are transferable to the other two countries. We will explore how to differentiate your 'Lars Larson' from all the others and how to find your parish of birth if you don't know. Our research in these countries can take us back to the 1600s. Even if you have started your search in these records, you will learn some new techniques that may change how you search. Let's get started. She lectures nationally and has written articles for *National Genealogical Society Quarterly*, *Swedish American Genealogist*, and many others. Jill is past president of the Seattle Genealogical Society, and a member of many local genealogical societies.



Fårikål (mutton in cabbage) is a favorite hearty soup in Norway and is a good Autumn dish. This dish is usually served with boiled potatoes and flatbread. This National Dish of Norway has an honor festival dedicated to it in late September.

Fårikålens festdag 30. September: The people decided as early as 1972. More than forty years later, the people were challenged again: What is Norway's national law? This time, too, the resounding answer was: Fårikål! Fårikål Feast Day is celebrated on the last Thursday in September every year.

Fårikål (mutton in cabbage)

(Serves 4-6)

- 4 lbs mutton or lamb
- 4 lbs cabbage
- 1 tbsp salt
- 3 cups water
- 1/3 cup flour

Cut meat into serving pieces. Layer mutton and slices of cabbage in a Dutch oven; sprinkle with salt and pepper between layers. Add boiling water. Simmer for 1 ½ hours. Stir flour into the stock to thicken. Serve with boiled potatoes and flatbread.


