Recipe of the Month - **Gazpacho**

Gazpacho is a cold soup, usually based on tomatoes and cucumbers, but everyone has their own favorite version. This is one I have been using this summer with variations as noted. njs

Ingredients

6 ripe tomatoes (about 3lbs or 6 cups chopped)
1 red onion finely chopped (or try a walla walla)
1 cucumber peeling and chopped)
1 red or orange bell pepper chopped
1 small jalapeno chopped (Optional)
1 clove garlic, minced
1/4th cup olive oil
1/4th cup balsamic or red wine vinegar
Juice of 1 lemon
1 tsp Worcestershire sauce (optional)
½ tsp ground cumin
2 tbsp basil leaves chopped
Salt and Pepper to taste
Chopped fresh parsley and chives



INSTRUCTIONS

Place all ingredients in a large bowl. Use an immersion blender or blend in batches, to desired smoothness. A good idea is to puree some and leave the rest chunky.

Adjust the seasonings to taste with more salt, pepper, sugar, or Tabasco.

Place in a non-reactive container (tomatoes are acidic) to store. Chill several hours or overnight to allow the flavors to blend.

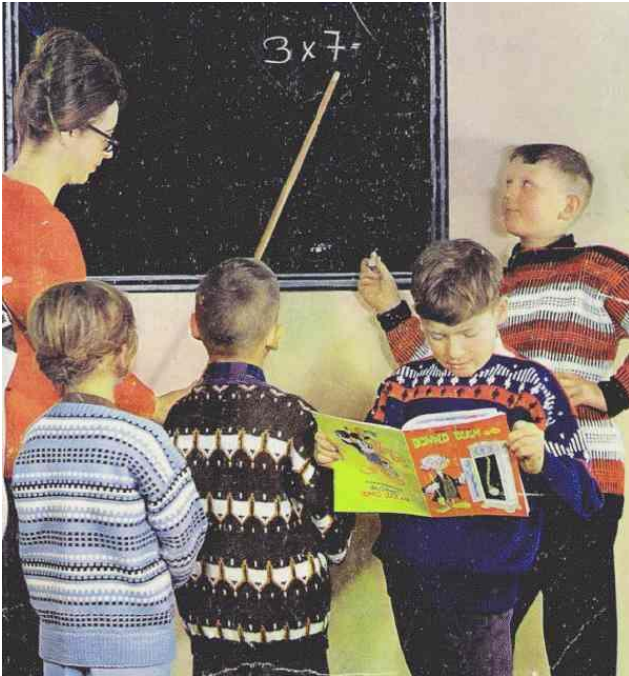
Other vegetables such as celery, zucchini, broccoli, may be added.

Coarsely chopped chives and parsley may be used as garnish.

Serve the cold soup with bread or crackers on the side.

Autumn in Norway

The mountain areas are especially beautiful this time of year, and many Norwegians go **hiking in the mountains or forests with their family** during the autumn break in October. It is berry picking time. And in the North, the northern lights start to dance again.



Back to School Time

The Norwegian school system is divided into three parts. Elementary School (Barneskoll) with ages six to thirteen, Lower Secondary School (Ungdomsskole) ages thirteen to sixteen and Upper Secondary (Videregående) ages sixteen to nineteen.

Barneskoll and Ungdomsskole are mandatory. Primary school (Barneskoll) is grade 1-7. A normal grade four student studies math, English, science, world religion, aesthetics, music, geography, history and social studies. There are no grades given in Primary School.

Lower Secondary School (Ungdomsskole) are grades 8-10. This is now the time that grades will be given. Grades along with where students live in the country will determine if they get into the Upper Secondary School of their choice. There are three branches to Upper Secondary. They are "General" (Language and History), "Mercantile" (Accounting) and "Vocational" (Electronics, Carpentry etc).

Just as in the United States, children did distant learning during the COVID pandemic but have now returned to the classroom.

The school year in Norway starts in mid-August and goes until late June of the following year. It is divided into two terms split by the Christmas break, which runs from mid-December to early January.

Norway has achieved a remarkable educational system. Adult literacy exceeds 99 percent. The public education system in the country is one of the best in the world.

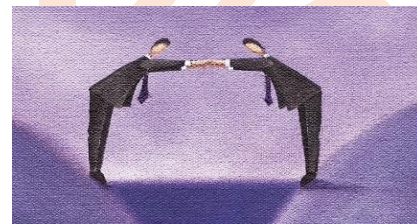
