



The final double breakthrough of the two Herrenknecht tunnel boring machines (TBM) "Anna" and "Magda" in the Norwegian town of Ski completed the excavation of both 20-m long tunnel tubes of the Follo Line Railway. This concludes the tunneling work on what is currently the country's largest infrastructure project. The first two TBM's, "Oueen eufemla" & Queen Ellsiv" had already reached their destination in Oslo on Sep. 11, 2018. The miners and guests cheered loudly when the machines broke through.




